The picture of sport in our school after 2 years of Sports Premium:	Sport has always played a large part in the life of Cunningham Hill School, both within and outside the curriculum. Staff gave up their time to run a variety of different sports based clubs and, together with coaches from outside sporting associations this enabled nearly all our children, whatever their need or ability, to participate in an active club each term. Inter and intra sport for all continued to increase as did the participation of our older children in helping to deliver sporting activities and competitions. The PE curriculum is broad and has a structured programme of progression in all areas with a uniform system of assessment. The school is excellently resourced with PE equipment for every area of the curriculum. In 2014-15 we had our most successful year ever in inter school competitive sport and achieved the Gold School Games Award, which reflects the success of our previous Sports Premium Plan.
