

## CUNNINGHAM HILL JUNIOR SCHOOL PE and SPORTS PREMIUM PLAN 2016-17

The picture of sport in our school after 3 years of Sports Premium:	Sport has always played a large part in the life of Cunningham Hill School, both within and outside the curriculum. Staff give up their time to run a variety of different extracurricular sports / fitness based clubs and, together with coaches from outside sporting associations, this has ensured that all our children, whatever their need or ability, participate in an active club each term. Inter and intra sport for all has again continued to increase, as has the participation of our older children in helping to deliver sporting activities and competitions. The PE curriculum is broad and has a structured programme of progression in all areas, with a uniform system of assessment. The school is excellently resourced with PE equipment for every area of the curriculum. 2015-16 was another very successful year for inter school competitive sport; the school not only achieved the <b>Gold School Games Award</b> , for the second year in succession, but was awarded <b>St Albans and District Sports School of the Year</b> .

All children will continue to experience an exciting, enjoyable, diverse and challenging PE curriculum supplemented by a wide range of extra-curricular activities, clubs and teams. Those who are talented will continue to be channelled to develop their talents, those who may be reluctant to participate or have special needs of any kind will be encouraged to participate in activities that they will enjoy and hopefully benefit from for the rest of their lives. Our staff will continue to receive support with planning, teaching and assessment from an experienced part time Key Stage 2 teacher (PE Subject Leader) and a NQT who specialises in PE.

The impact is measured, firstly through planning i.e. plans are continually having to be revised upwards to accommodate the improvement in performance, and secondly through our assessment data. At the end of each unit the children are assessed and their progress monitored. For example, at the end of our invasion games netball unit in Year 5, 20% of the Year group had improved their attainment by a level, 40% of the children were performing above age related expectations and only 6% below. A similar pattern is being reflected throughout other units and year groups and having an impact on our intra and inter school sport.

These may be organised by the School Sports Partnership "School Games", St Albans Sports Association and sports leagues, or other sporting organisations.</p>	<p>The school is actively involved in the local Sports Partnership and will continue to support other sporting organisations who are offering competitive opportunities to our children. The PE subject leader will attend network meetings and co-ordinate events with school staff. The school will liaise with other schools to obtain B and C team / friendly fixtures to extend competition to more of our children.
